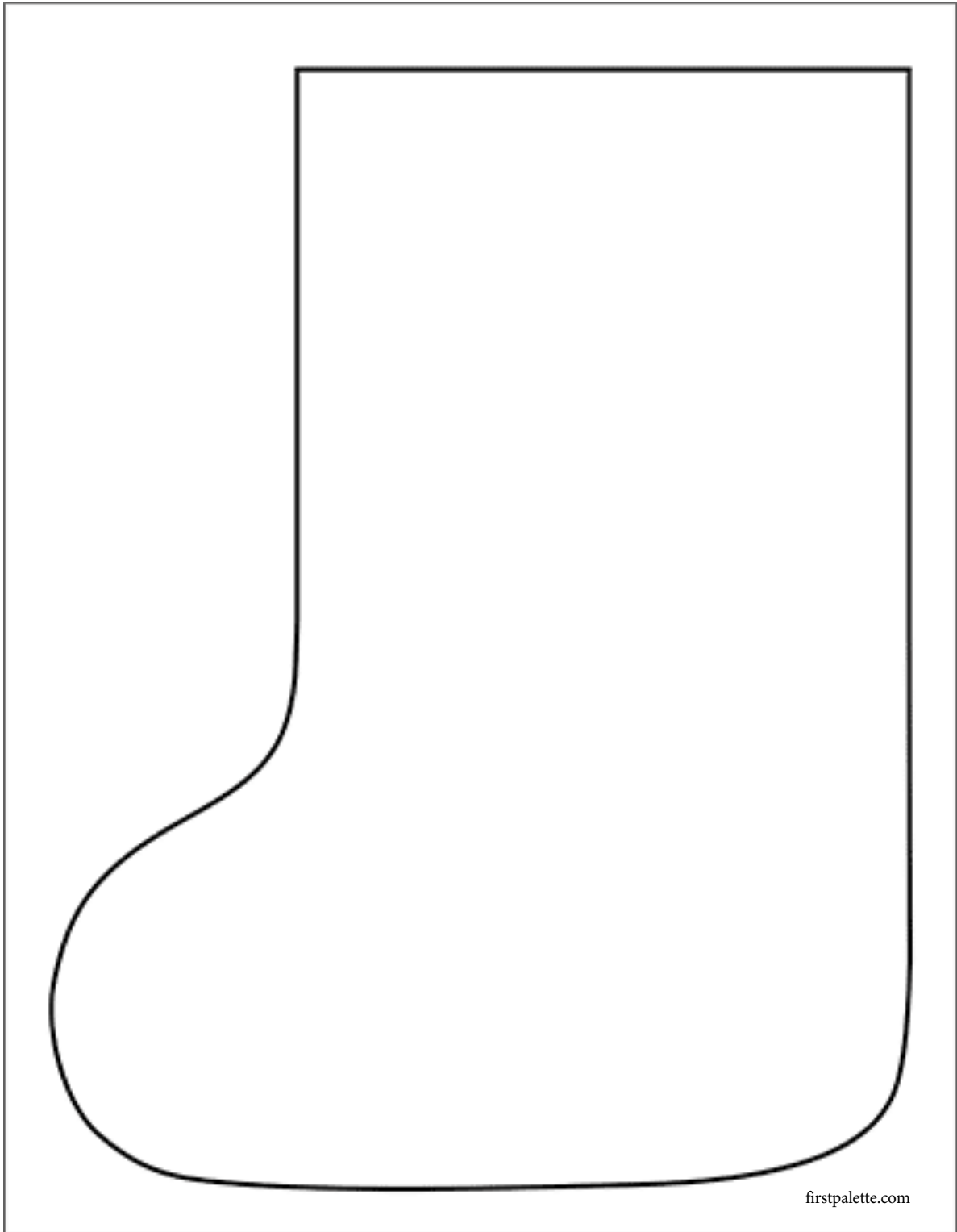

## CHRISTMAS IN THE KITCHEN

Baking Christmas biscuits is such a fun way to start off the festive season and they make great decorations for the tree, too.

### Ingredients

175g dark muscovado sugar  
85g golden syrup  
100g butter  
3 tsp ground ginger  
1 tsp ground cinnamon  
350g plain flour  
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda  
1 egg

### Method

1. Heat the sugar, golden syrup and butter until melted. Mix the spices and flour in a bowl. Dissolve the bicarbonate of soda in 1 tsp cold water. Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients, add the melted sugar mix, egg and bicarbonate of soda. Mix well.
2. Leave the mixture to cool, then put in the fridge for one hour.
3. Heat oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5. Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface and knead. Cut the dough in half. Thinly roll out one half on a lightly floured surface. Cut into shapes with cutters, then transfer to baking trays.  
NB. If you plan to hang the biscuits up, make a small hole in the top of each one using a skewer. Repeat with remaining dough.
4. Bake for 12-15 minutes until they darken slightly. Cool for a few minutes on the baking trays, then transfer to a wire rack to cool and harden.
5. Decorate as you wish using icing sugar, melted chocolate, silver balls, etc. Thread ribbon through the holes if you want to hang the biscuits on your tree.
