EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Flora & Fern Kindness along the Way is the second book in the Flora & Fern series, following on from Flora & Fern Wonder in the Woods. This time the reader is taken on an exciting adventure when Fern gets lost and ends up in the city, miles from his woodland home. How does he feel and how does he cope? The story explores different settings and homes and encounters plenty of kindness along the way. A heartwarming tale about feeling lost and feeling found with all the characters from the first book plus a new one! The Duchess's carrot cake breakfast muffins are a real treat at the end.

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DISCUSSION TOPICS

Before, during and after reading the book

- 1. Introduce Flora & Fern Kindness along the Way to the children and ask them what they think the story might be about.
- 2. Ask the children if they've read the first book, Flora & Fern Wonder in the Woods.
- 3. Flora & Fern are playing their favourite game at the beginning of the story. What is it? Do you like this game? What other games do you like playing?
- 4. Why does Fern initially enjoy having time to himself?
- 5. How does he feel when he realises he's wandered off too far? (Discuss emotions here frightened but also excited when he sees the city lights.)
- 6. How is the city different to the woods? Name 10 differences. Are there any similarities?
- 7. How is Flora feeling and also all the other woodland animals?
- 8. What's Baz's plan?
- 9. Who is Nigel? What sort of character is he? How does he show kindness?
- 10. Describe Nigel's home in detail. (This could be a good starting point to discuss upcycling/recycling.)
- 11. Does Baz's plan work?
- 12. What does Flora tell Fern about home and feeling lost and found?
- 13. After reading the book, ask them what they thought of the story. Which was their favourite part and why?







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The Duchess's Carrot Cake Muffins

Make these delicious carrot cake muffins for breakfast!

Ingredients (makes 12/14 muffins)

- · 250g self-raising flour
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 175g light brown sugar
- · 1tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp nutmeg (grated)
- · Pinch of salt
- 150ml rapeseed oil
- 175ml milk
- · 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- · 150g grated carrots
- 100g raisins
- 1 tbsp juice of an orange

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan. Place the muffin cases into a muffin tray and leave them to one side. A cupcake tray with cupcake cases is fine if you don't have a muffin tray.
- 2. Mix the flour, bicarbonate of soda, sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg in a bowl. Add in a pinch of salt.
- 3. In another bowl, mix the oil, milk, eggs and vanilla extract. Then add these ingredients to the first bowl. Keep mixing until the mixture is smooth.
- 4. With a spatula, fold in the grated carrot, raisins and orange juice.
- 5. Spoon the mixture into the muffin/cupcake cases.
- 6. Bake in the oven for approximately 25-30 minutes. You can test if they are ready by putting a knife or skewer into a muffin and see if it comes out clean. If there is mixture on the knife, pop them back into the oven for a couple of minutes.
- 7. When they are ready, leave them to cool in the muffin tray for 30 minutes before moving them to a wire rack.
- 8. If you want to decorate them, you can always make a cream cheese frosting to put on the top. Flora and Fern prefer them as they are though!
