HOW THE BOOK ENHANCES LEARNING


Emily Green's Garden demonstrates the beauty of gardening and the importance of sharing things with others. It deals with the fragile nature of the environment whilst exploring creativity and play.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- I. Introduce *Emily Green's Garden* to the children and ask them what they think the story might be about?
 - a. Get the children to look closely at the front cover:
 - b. What can they see?
 - c. Why do they think those particular colours were chosen for the front cover?
- 2. What do they think Emily is doing on the front cover?
- 3. Does anyone have their own garden at home?

After reading the book:






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I. Ask the children:

- a. What did they think of the story?
- b. What were their favourite parts or least favourite parts and why?
- c. Would they have done anything differently to Emily in the story?
- 2. Ask them to think of an unusual place that they could grow a garden or a plant?
- 3. Where is the biggest and/or most beautiful garden they have ever seen? Why was it so beautiful?
